Assistance for Emergency Health

Abstract: The public health agencies of Pacific island nations have the responsibility of maintaining health during national emergencies. Assistance for completion of this task is available to the Pacific islands in the form of technical, informational, educational and humanitarian aid. Assistance for Pacific island preparedness and response may originate from local, jurisdictional, regional and international levels. The Internet also now offers many useful resources for disaster education, collaboration and aid. This article discusses mechanisms and resources that Pacific island health officials may utilize to promote emergency health within their own jurisdictions.

I. Introduction

Assistance for Emergency Health

Assistance for emergency health is available to Pacific public health and medical agencies from groups at the local, regional and international level. This assistance may be categorized as follows:

- Technical: assessments, consultations and capacitybuilding
- Informational: internet search engines, journals, listservers, email, media
- Educational: schools, distance learning, workshops, conferences
- Humanitarian: food, water, shelter, medical care, pharmaceuticals, money, human resources, logistical support and communications

II. Local assistance

Local assistance during an emergency comes from our neighbors ... from the next home, the next village, the next island, and the next nation. This type of assistance is usually the first to arrive after a disaster and in many cases will have a remarkable impact upon the final health outcome of the disaster victims. There are good examples of this cooperation and working together among jurisdictions that Pacific island nations may also benefit from knowing.

During the 1970's Los Angeles and other cities in California began to grow into large suburbs comprised of separate and independent city and county jurisdictions. Also during this time the area was prone to wildfire. The state soon experienced a phenomenon where wildfires, (ignoring political boundaries as they are known to do), would cross jurisdictions and thus *necessitate* that jurisdiction emergency responders work together to battle the blaze. They were successful. There is a saying that, "All disaster response is local". Local people are most successful when they work together.

So, along with fighting the fire, these local jurisdictions also developed a series of successful methods and approaches for emergency response that are now used throughout the entire U.S., and in many areas of the world. Examples of these successful methods of helping your neighbor include the following:

- 1. The Incident Command (or Management) System: A system for organizing activities and managing staff to work together during an emergency response.
- 2. Mutual Aid Agreements: pacts made by jurisdictions in advance of a disaster committing to help each other and work together.
- Memorandums of Understanding: pacts made between jurisdictions and other groups in advance of a disaster that describe how they will help each other and work together.

III. Mutual aid agreements and memorandums of understanding

Local agreements

There are many opportunities for jurisdictions to develop Memorandums of Understanding (MOU's) and/or Mutual Aid Agreements (MAA's) that may occur on a local level. These agreements establish in advance the roles and responsibilities that may be expected among both governmental and non-governmental partners. These agreements may be formed between various sub-national agencies on a state or local level. They may also include agreements between the jurisdictional government and private firms or merchants. Table 1 is a list of examples of private firms and

Regional agreements

The constitution of the Federated States of Micronesia says that the Pacific Ocean serves to link the island nations rather than separate them. This statement illustrates the valuable asset of good neighbors that Pacific islanders may call upon when faced with disaster. This good neighbor policy is not only limited to the natural goodwill among Pacific island peoples but also reflects the common economic, cultural and family ties that also exist here.

In times of disaster, it's expected that neighbors help neighbors. This expectation may best be planned for and detailed in advance of the event in the form of MAA's and MOU's. This promotes regional relationships and serves to facilitate a more cost-effective sharing of common resources. Pacific regional public health, emergency management and medical organizations have already served as an effective network for emergency health collaborations. These organizations may also serve as platforms for re-

International agreements

In the case of a major disaster involving this jurisdiction, there are multiple national governments and international non-governmental organizations, NGO's, that would likely respond with assistance. Other nations that may come to offer support and assistance include New Zealand, Australia, France, Taiwan, USA, and Japan. NGO's and International Organizations that may likely respond to a disaster within the jurisdiction may include WHO, Red Cross, Peace Corps and the United Nations, among others. The efficiency of this external assistance may be facilitated and amplified by planning in advance for the process. MAA's and MOU's provide a mechanism for the time sensitive activation and coordination of such humanitarian assistance efforts.

IV. Resources for information, education and communication

In order to work together, neighbors must be able to learn and share valuable information. They must be able to find aid and communicate their needs to this source for assistance. The internet offers a uniquely valuable tool for Pacific public health agencies to gain this information and education, as well as communicate that knowledge with our peers and our constituents. The Secretariat of the Pacific Community's PACNET and the CDC's Pacific Emergency Health Initiative PEHI-NET offer Pacific islanders with an easy access to information and communication resources specifically designed for prevention and control of Pacific island health emergencies. The internet is also now blossoming with a nearly endless list of disaster and emergency-related websites. These contain a broad scope of information and training opportunities to aid in developing emergency in disaster health.

Provided below is a list of websites that contain valuable references from which Pacific island public health and medical workers may also gain additional information and potential resources. While the list is extensive, it is not meant to be all-inclusive. The list does manage to provide general as well as specific information on a variety of topics and should provide an adequate entry point into the virtual realm of public health and emergency management.
